Urgent Message to parents/guardians of all 7th grade students -

New vaccines needed for 7th grade students!

Letters were sent home in June this past year notifying you that the State Department of Health and Mental Hygiene has issued a list of new immunizations requirements for the 2014-2015 school. This letter notified you of the immunization that your student needs to be in compliance.

Failure to show proof of these needed immunizations will result in exclusion from school effective Monday, September 22, 2014. This means your child will not be allowed to attend school until these records are received. If you have any questions or concerns please contact the Oakland Mills middle school health room at 410-313-6941. Please ask to speak with Ms. Eldridge or Ms. Milton.

The last free Walk-in immunization clinic for school requirements will be held on Friday, 9/12/14 at Howard County Health Department 8930 Stanford Blvd Columbia, Md 21045, from 830am-11:30am and 1:30pm – 4:00pm.

CIVILITY POLICY

(Policy 1000)

The Board of Education of Howard County values diversity and commonality and is committed to a culture that fosters free and open communication. The Board believes that an environment of mutual respect and civil conduct between and among students, school system employees, parents, volunteers, and the general public is critical to the achievement of students and staff. To that end, the county encourages the following behaviors:
