Dear Families,

Last week you received your child's progress report. The purpose of the progress report is to communicate with you about how well your child is doing in all subjects. We want each student at OMMS to be successful, and want each student to be able to identify "what is going well" at school as well as identify areas for growth. Parents, if you want to touch base with your child's teacher(s), and feel that waiting until a formal conference time in November is too far away, you may consider setting up a phone or in-person conference with your child's teacher. Here are some ways to communicate with school:

Email the teacher(s) directly and inquire about any questions or concerns. All staff emails can be accessed from our school website, http://omms.hcpss.org

<u>Call the school</u> and leave a message for the teacher to call you, with a good number and time that you can be reached. (It is possible that the teacher may not be available at that time because he or she is teaching, so you may consider leaving a message for a phone number that can be reached after 2:40 @ dismissal).

<u>Call the Counseling Center</u> to speak with your child's counselor @ 410-313-6940. Did you know that you can request a "group conference" and meet with more than one teacher at once? You can request this to be set up through the conference center. **Partnering with you is our priority!** –Kathy Orlando

Student Dress Code (Policy 9210)

Student dress and appearance are the basic responsibility of students and their parents/guardians as long as they are consistent with the school system's responsibility to ensure that school environments are healthy, safe and conducive to student learning. It is a violation of this policy for any student to wear attire that interferes with the educational mission of the schools, is disruptive to the school environment, or that could endanger the health or safety of that student or others during school hours and school activities. This includes, but is not limited to, attire that:

Unduly exposes or reveals skin or undergarments. This may include: tank tops; halter tops; tops that are strapless, low cut, or expose the midriff; pants worn low or loose that expose skin or undergarments.

Causes or is likely to cause a substantial or material disruption to school activities or the orderly operation of the school. This may include buttons, display bands, armbands, flags, decals or other badges of symbolic expression.

Covers the head, including hats, sunglasses, bandanas, hoods and visors, or head coverings of any kind.

Depicts profanity, obscenity, the use of weapons, or violence.

Promotes use of tobacco, drugs, alcohol, or other illegal or harmful products.

Promotes, implies or contains sexually suggestive messages.

Depicts gang affiliation.

Contains language or symbols that demean an identifiable person or group or infringe on the rights of others.

Contains rude, disrespectful, or discourteous expressions inconsistent with civil discourse and behavior.

May damage school property.

Attire worn for medical reasons or required in practicing a religious belief is permitted.

Student attire will support a healthy and safe academic school environment. Any student failing to comply with the direction of an administrator is subject to disciplinary action in accordance with Policy 9200 Discipline and the Student Code of Conduct
